Restoration of the Shrine of St Oliver Plunkett (1625 – 1681)

To mark the 400th anniversary of the birth of St Oliver Plunkett and the designation of St Peter's Church as a Jubilee Church in this Jubilee Year of Hope, after consultation with St Peter's Parish Finance Committee, St Peter's Parish Pastoral Council and St Patrick's Archdiocesan Trust Limited, restoration work will commence next week at the St Oliver Plunkett shrine area of St Peter's Church aiming to create a homogenous prayerful space that honours the memory of the martyred Archbishop of Armagh, fosters a deeper spiritual connection for pilgrims, and preserves the historical and architectural integrity of the church. The design draws inspiration from St Oliver's life of faith, his commitment to reconciliation, and his embodiment of the Communion of Saints.

Key elements include the following: the replacement of the flooring with a continuous tiled design, fostering a sense of unity; the introduction of a brass baldachin featuring flame-shaped panels, symbolising the Holy Spirit at work in and through St Oliver; retention and restoration of the 1995 freestanding spired metal structure housing the relic of the head, enhancing its craftsmanship and lighting to serve as the focal point of the space; relocating of additional relics to new wall-mounted reliquaries adjacent to the main shrine; the use of soft, diffused lighting to highlight the shrine's elements and to create an inviting, contemplative atmosphere; the installation of educational displays exploring St Oliver's life with themes of perseverance and reconciliation; the introduction of comfortable kneelers and purposeful seating. The revitalised shrine will embody the Catholic tradition of the Communion of Saints, providing pilgrims with a sacred space that fosters unity with the saints and offers spiritual strength.

To facilitate restoration works, the Shrine area will be cordoned off. St Oliver's head will be temporarily housed in the Sacred Heart chapel area of St Peter's Church. It is hoped that the works will be completed by the end of June. Apologies for the inconvenience.
